The Abilene Education Foundation offers programs to enrich education in the Abilene Independent School District and to encourage and help AISD students to pursue a college education.

#### ADDITIONAL AEF PROGRAMS

Young Masters Juried Art Exhibition provides an annual juried art exhibition at the Grace Museum for Advanced Placement Studio Art students to recognize and encourage outstanding artistic expression with a quality museum exhibition.

**TLC (Teachers in the Limelight Celebration)** honors the dedicated work of teachers in AISD with campus recognition, a formal dinner and a monetary award. A TLC teacher possesses integrity and a love for teaching that spills into the classroom. Awards are funded by the Edwin and Agnes Jennings Sr. Teaching Excellence Endowment.

**ACT (Achievement, Creativity and Technology)** Grants respond to requests from AISD educators and non-profits for the purpose of improving achievement or rewarding academic achievement related to the education of AISD students. These grants are awarded in three cycles during the school year.

COOL (College Offers Opportunities for Life) program places four full-time college advisors in Abilene ISD high schools to assist students who are first in their families to attend college with financial aid, college applications, scholarships and college tours.
